Good News: Born That We No More May Die

It is the season of Christmas again.

Christmas for some of us can be the best, and the most difficult of times. Amid all the challenges, in the world (Ukraine, Palestine, Myanmar), the Anglican Communion, our country, and our personal lives - we celebrate the birth of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. At the same time, we look forward and yearn for His second coming. We celebrate the gift of salvation that transforms us more and more to become like Jesus, and to do the works of God. We respond by bearing witness to this greatest miracle by propagating this Good News.

More than two thousand years ago, Luke (2:1-4) tells us that people throughout the Roman Empire were ordered to participate in the census. This is good news to the elite, the politicians, the businessmen, and the government. Taxes pour into the government coffers, economic activity picks up, military conscription has more candidates. To the citizens, it is a burden; heavier financial burden, people need to travel back to their hometowns, and sheep needs to be taken care of. The census is a reminder to the Jews that Caesar is not only King but God, and that they are in his Kingdom. Times were difficult. Yet God is already working out His purposes.



The people of God were eagerly anticipating a different kind of good news, a Messiah, the establishment of the Kingdom of God, freedom from the yoke of tyranny. God sent His Good News, His son Jesus Christ. This Good News is for everyone, unlike Caesar's, which is only good news for the elite, and oppressive to the rest. The Good News of Jesus Christ is for everyone, even the lowly, as in the case of the shepherds in Luke 2:1-21. This hope in God to save them is kept alive in the hearts of Mary and Joseph. Mary believed, Joseph obeyed, and together they were part of God's plan, and a vessel of His blessings. I love the hymn, "Hark the herald angels sing." My tears well up when I sing these words,

Mild he lays his glory by,
born that man no more may die,
born to raise us from the earth
born to give us second birth.

- "Mild he lays his glory by" – Jesus being God, became man in obedience to God the Father, to serve us. We too are challenged to serve as Jesus served.
- "born that man no more may die" – the purpose of Christ's birth was to free us from the most horrible enemy of life: spiritual and physical death. Therefore, there is nothing so bad, or so good,

Bishop Titus Chung elected the 7th Archbishop and Primate of the Anglican Church in South East Asia

OCT 9: BISHOP Titus Chung will succeed The Most Reverend Datuk Melter Jiki Tais, who has served as Archbishop of the Province since 2020.

The Rt Rev Dr Titus Chung Khiam Boon was elected to lead the Province of South East Asia at the Provincial Synod held in Singapore on Sept 26, 2023. The term of office of the Arch-bishop-elect will be from Feb 2024 to Feb 2028.

Bishop Titus is currently the 10th Bishop of Singapore for the Anglican Church. After his ordination in 1997, he served as priest, and then vicar, of the Chapel of the Holy Spirit until 2005 before becoming Priest-in-charge of the Mandarin congregation at St Andrew’s Cathedral. Married with two adult sons, he holds a Doctor of Philosophy from The University of Edinburgh in the United Kingdom.

The Archbishop of the Province of South East Asia leads and has spiritual

authority over the whole Province. He also represents the Province in its relation to the rest of the Anglican Communion and to other churches, and on its behalf to correspond with other Primates.

The outgoing Archbishop Melter Jiki Tais will continue to serve as the Bishop of Sabah.

Seramai 23 orang muda-mudi dilatih dalam penginjilan.



MINI MISI PENGINJILAN TELAH DIADAKAN DI KAMPUNG ORANG ASLI KOLAM AIR DENGKIL

Pada 9hb September 2023, bersama dengan muda-mudi English dari St. Paul's Petaling Jaya yang diketuai oleh Dss. Zaharah dan dengan kerjasama dari Pastor Aidil dengan team dari St.Paul's Chapel, Alam Jaya dan ketua Misi iaitu Bro. Dian dari St. Katherine's Kajang bersama jemaatnya telah mengadakan persekutuan dan penginjilan di Kampung Orang Asli, Kolam Air di Dengkil. Saya membawa team muda-mudi dari Pelayanan BM BOH untuk membantu saya memantau muda-mudi yang menginjil. Seramai 23 orang kami yang hadir. Seramai 16 orang Asli yang telah diinjil (dewasa dan kanak-kanak). Ini adalah pengalaman yang baru bagi muda-mudi English dan mereka sangat merasa teruja untuk mengikuti misi lagi pada masa akan datang.



TRAIN THE TRAINERS (DWM SCHOOL OF PRAYER COUNSELLING AND HEALING)

Pada 25hb September hingga 6hb Oktober 2023, selama 10 hari saya dan Revd. Juing Babia telah dipilih untuk mengikuti latihan Train the Trainers di Gereja St. James' Sentul. Seramai 24 orang kami telah dilengkapi pensyarah dari Raphah School of Prayer Counselling and Healing dan selepas tamat latihan ini kami perlu mengikuti 3 kali tutorial yang diadakan secara zoom seminggu sekali. Lewat daripada latihan ini, kami dilengkapi untuk lebih efektif lagi melaksanakan pelayan PHD (Preaching, Healing and Deliverance).

Bekerjasama dengan Pelayan BM BOH, kami telah mengadakan Kebaktian Kebangunan Rohani pada 28hb Oktober 2023 (Sabtu) di Beacon of Hope, Sri Manja, Selangor. Revd. Frank Lin telah dijemput untuk menjadi pengkhotbah pada masa itu. Seramai 48 orang yang hadir. Lewat daripada KKR ini, ramai yang mengalami kelukaan batin dan emosi dipulihkan agar lebih efektif dalam pelayan Tuhan.



LATIHAN PENGINJILAN DI PELAYANAN BM BOH SELANGOR DAN DI GEREJA ST. LUKE'S, KLUANG DI KALANGAN MUDA-MUDI DAN KANAK-KANAK

Harapan dan doa kita lewat dari pelayanan dan lawatan ke tiga buah kampung Orang Asli di Kampung Sungai Rasau, Puchong, Selangor, Kampung Kolam Air, Dengkil, Selangor dan Kampung Tanah Runtuh, Kluang Johor akan terjadinya penanaman gereja Anglikan di tempat-tempat ini dengan kerjasama gereja-gereja yang berdekatan.



Roma 10:8-17 AVB Alkitab Versi Borneo

Apakah yang dikatakan? “Firman itu begitu dekat denganmu, di mulutmu dan dalam hatimu (iaitu firman tentang iman yang kami isytiharkan): Jika kamu akui dengan mulutmu bahawa Yesus ialah Tuhan dan percaya dalam hatimu bahawa Allah telah membangkitkan-Nya daripada kematian, kamu akan diselamatkan; kerana dengan hatimu kamu beriman dan diperbenar, dan dengan mulutmu kamu mengaku lalu diselamatkan.” Sebagaimana tersurat dalam Kitab Suci, “Sesiapa yang percaya kepada-Nya tidak akan diaibkan.” Kerana tidak ada perbezaan antara orang Yahudi dengan orang Yunani, kerana Tuhan yang sama berkuasa atas semuanya dan melimpahkan berkat ke atas semua yang menyeru kepada-Nya. Kerana “Sesiapa yang menyeru nama Tuhan akan diselamatkan.” Jadi, bagaimana mereka dapat menyeru kepada-Nya sedangkan mereka tidak beriman kepada-Nya? Dan bagaimana mereka dapat beriman kepada-Nya sedangkan mereka tidak pernah mendengar

tentang-Nya? Dan bagaimana mereka dapat mendengar sedangkan tiada sesiapa pun yang mengkhabarkan tentang-Nya? Dan bagaimana orang dapat mengajar kecuali dihantar? Sebagaimana tersurat dalam Kitab Suci, “Alangkah indahnya kaki mereka yang membawa berita baik!” Akan tetapi, tidak semua yang mahu menerima berita Injil itu. Sebagaimana kata Yesaya, “Tuhan, siapa yang percaya akan perkhabaran yang kami sampaikan?” Oleh itu, iman datang daripada mendengar perkhabaran itu, dan perkhabaran itu didengar melalui sabda Kristus.
